From the 2nd March 2009, the WIA under contract arrangements with the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) has taken responsibility for all amateur callsign administration. In undertaking this role the WIA will incur costs that the ACMA has agreed may be reasonably recovered.

The fee for the issue of a Level 1 recommendation is **\$5.00** inc GST. A level 1 Recommendation means that the WIA will recommend the allocation of the next available callsign from the applicable Callsign List and issue a Recommendation. Further details on the ACMA Amateur Callsign Structure can be found on the WIA website or in the latest WIA Call Book.

If you consider the normal validity period of 28 days for a Recommendation is insufficient, please provide the reasons on a separate page and attach the page to the application form and also tick Yes in answer to D "Is there any other information attached to this application?"

If you are applying for an Australian amateur licence on the basis of a foreign qualification or current foreign amateur licence, please attach a certified copy of the foreign qualification or current foreign licence, and if the document is not in the English language a certified translation of the document, and also a certified copy of the photo page of your passport and also tick Yes in answer to D "Is there any other information attached to this application?"

The Recommendation by the WIA of a callsign remains valid for 28 days. In the event that you cannot make your application for a licence to the ACMA within this period, please contact the WIA National office for an extension. If a Callsign Recommendation lapses after the expiry period, the callsign is placed on the WIA Public List of Available Callsigns.
