WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY EXPERIMENTERS' GRIEVANCES KILLING THE STUDY.

Societies are being formed chiefly for the mutual improvement of members, and it is also suggested, as a means of doing away with all fear of interfering with official messages, that the least power necessary to obtain effective communication be used, and that experimenters wait until other stations operating from the same wave length have ceased speaking. It is also set out in a booklet which has been issued, that persons should not seek a license to experiment in radio-telegraphy until they are capable of operating at a speed of not less than 12 words a minute. It was also stated that an interesting feature of the publication is a complete list of the recognised calls for commercial stations, land and sea, as well as experimenters' stations.
